

Can batteries be removed?

Don't forget, some batteries are built into electronic devices and cannot be removed. These batteries still pose the same risks! These common everyday batteries can be safely disposed of in household used in products such as smoke detectors, trash.

How do you dispose of a single use battery?

Every year in the United States, millions of single use and rechargeable batteries are bought, used and recycled or disposed of in the trash. Batteries come in various chemistries, types and sizes to fit their use. Single-use batteries can generally be removed from the device when they stop powering the device.

Can you recycle a car battery?

Car batteries, rechargeable batteries (including AA, 9-volt, the one in the back of your cell phone, and the like), and even button cell watch batteries contain heavy metals and other toxic chemicals. Recycling batteries like these is often required by law.

Can you put batteries in trash?

Check with your local collection agency to see what types of batteries are accepted. Household trash: The only types of batteries that can be thrown away safely in the trash are single-use alkaline and zinc-carbon batteries. No other batteries should ever be placed in household trash.

Most household batteries are loose, portable, or intentionally easy to access in the device they power. Other batteries are securely embedded into devices and not designed to be removed by the consumer.
