

Who owns Uganda refinery company?

The Uganda Refinery Holding Company, a subsidiary of the UNOC will hold a participating interest of up to 40% in the Refinery Company on behalf of UNOC and Government of Uganda. The shareholders' agreement lays out the financial obligations of each part such as cash calls, defaults, and stipulates the voting rights.

Who owns crude oil in Uganda?

The crude oil owners are the Government of Uganda and UNOC, TotalEnergies E&P Uganda and China National Offshore Oil Corporation (CNOOC) Uganda Limited. The Shareholders' Agreement will be signed by shareholders of the refinery company.

What is the Uganda refinery project?

The Uganda Refinery Project includes: the storage terminal itself, for the refinery products located at Namwabula in Mpigi District. Alpha MBM Investments, an investment firm from the United Arab Emirates (UAE) is now the lead partner in the oil refinery project.

Who will sign the shareholders' agreement with Uganda refinery company?

The Shareholders' Agreement will be signed by shareholders of the refinery company. The Uganda Refinery Holding Company, a subsidiary of the UNOC will hold a participating interest of up to 40% in the Refinery Company on behalf of UNOC and Government of Uganda.

How much money will Uganda earn from oil development?

The development works expected to commence this year, will see Uganda earn at least US\$4b (about sh15.2 trillion) in investment, on top of the ongoing oil related works. The new investor was announced by Hon. Dr. Ruth Nankabirwa, the Minister for Energy and Mineral Development.

Uganda National Oil Company (UNOC) has secured a 300-acre piece of land in Wakiso District on which to build the Kampala Storage Terminal (KST). The land, in Namwambula village, will host a 60-million litre storage facility for petroleum products.

Kampala Storage Terminal (KST) as it is popularly known, when complete will keep up to 320 million litres of refined petroleum products.

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Another first was recently announced by Gilkes Energy in the UK, who released details of its planned 900MW Earba Storage Project in Scotland, the company's first pumped storage hydropower scheme. Earba Storage Project will store up to 33,000 MWh of energy, making it the largest such scheme in the UK in terms of energy stored.
